Dear Mr. Chairman:

I have received your letter of April 22 requesting that Philip Morris provide the Subcommittee with all documents relating to Dr. Victor DeNoble's research by the close of business on April 26 and also asking us to agree to waive the confidentiality agreement between Dr. Mele and Philip Morris.

We agree to waive Dr. Mele's confidentiality agreement so that he may testify before your Subcommittee.

While we have begun the collection of the documents you have requested, there are still several different locations and files which remain to be searched. I am reasonably confident that they will contain documents responsive to your request. We have deployed a sizeable group to review these locations and files. In order to be confident that all appropriate areas and files have been searched and documents reviewed for production, I respectfully request that we be given until Monday, May 9 to produce the documents to the Subcommittee.

We wish to fully cooperate with your request and this short extension of time will enable us to do so.
